

## **Brief Overview of the Module – Annotated Bibliography**

This module has been developed as part of an ECDF (eLearning Collaborative Development Fund) project called: *Information Literacy<sup>1</sup> e-Learning Modules – Reusable and Portable across a College of Education, a Polytechnic and a University Project.* Staff from three institutions – University of Otago, Dunedin College of Education and Otago Polytechnic – are working together on the project.

As each module is developed, usability testing on the “raw prototype” is carried out with staff and students at the three institutions. The modules will also be evaluated as part of a research project when they are piloted at the three institutions. These processes will enable a relatively polished learning resource to be produced prior to its release to the tertiary sector.
